Taking home of vehicles does occur in SO to cut down on response times.</i>	
<b>FOUR DAY/10 HOUR WORK WEEKS.</b> Probable savings on utilities & maintenance & cleaning at all building of county offices. Reduced TM requests could lead to increased office efficiency. Fuel expenses reduced by one day less use.	EXP	TBD	On-going	<i>Utility savings somewhat dependent on whether a building - or large section of building - can be closed.</i>	

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<b>HOURS OF OPERATION:</b> Operate Mon-Thurs 8-7 pm. Staff could choose to work 4 tens, 4 eights, or less. Stay open during lunch & later hours for increased flexibility.	EXP	TBD	On-going	<i>May see increase of TM requests, stress claims and employees juggle childcare and longer days. Many services MUST operate 24/7.</i>
<b>JAIL BOOKING HOURS REDUCTION:</b> Reduce booking hours to the sixteen consecutive busiest hours per day.	EXP	TBD	On-going	Booking inmates into jail costs in excess of \$5 million annually for 12-15k bookings.
<b>JAIL BOOKING FEE:</b> \$150 booking fee would help cover cost of \$5 million annually to process bookings.	REV	(1,500,000)	On-going	Need to check legal issues. Would generate a lot of political opposition from the municipalities.
<b>INMATE FEES:</b> Assess fees for medical visits, grievances, vitiation, clothing, daily fee, alternative programs	REV	TBD	On-going	May have some political implications.
<b>FUGITIVE FROM JUSTICE DAILY FEE:</b> Charged to other states for inmates housed in jail being held on fugitive warrants. It states no money would be saved.
<b>MUNICIPAL INMATE DAILY FEE:</b> Municipalities would pay daily rate for lodging inmates into the Lane County Jail (Oakridge, Coburg, Cottage Grove, Junction City & Florence). <b>DELEGATED CONTRACT SIGNING AUTHORITY TO DEPARTMENT DIRECTORS -</b> Increase department directors authority to sign contracts to decrease administrative costs. 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<b>CONTRACTS - LONGER TERMS.</b> Processing contracts for longer than 3 year period would decrease costs for subcontracted services and decrease frequency of competitive selection procedure.	EXP	TBD	On-going	<i>Current policy of 3 years is based on theory of a contract not 'outliving' a Board of Commissioners so that changes can be made if desired.</i>
<b>ELECTIONS VOTING EQUIPMENT:</b> Pay for new elections equipment out of PCARF Fund	EXP	(450,000)	One-Time & On-going	<i>The funds within the PCRFB Fund do not all belong to the General Fund and are allocated specifically for replacing computers every 4 years as well as servers/printers, etc. There is not an excess of \$450,000 in the fund to do this proposal.</i>
<b>HIRING FREEZE:</b> Encouraging early retirements from certain departments would also relieve budget pressures.	EXP	Unknown	Unknown	<i>Cannot be selective when offering early retirement - must offer to anyone who qualifies.</i>
<b>DAMAGE CLAIMS BUDGETED:</b> Lower budget to move conservative expense number for claims in FY 10-11.	EXP	TBD	One-time	Lowering the budget for the claims will not create any savings. The funds would need to be reserved in the event the claims do indeed come in as currently budgeted. The increase this person is seeing is related to a reclassification of Unemployment Claims from "Purchased Insurance" to "Damage Claims" Not a true increase. If indeed we find after an actuarial that the reserve is higher than needed, any refund from the fund goes back to the Funds that have paid it. It is not believed that the fund is overfunded, and in fact may need further increases after the next actuarial.

Part time employees skill levels may well not match (i.e. same person couldn't qualify to be a nurse &amp; an OA). NOTE: Only AFSCME part-time employees receive full-time benefits, so savings would likely be lower even if consolidation possible.</p>
<p><b>SUSPEND ALL REMODELING PROJECTS</b> -Any project over \$100,000 should have a sustainable documented repayment plan in place prior to approval of the funding. No general fund dollars should be allocated for updating, reorganizing or other superficial changes.</p>	EXP	Unknown	Unknown		
<p><b>CUT BACK SOS FORMS TO THRESHHOLD LEVELS</b> - Government services forms reduced to threshold levels and eliminate \$40k in Justice Courts, HHS Prevention add &amp; Youth Services Add. <p><b>USER FEE INCREASES</b> - Analysis of all fees to increase compliance &amp; non-compliance</p>	REV	Unknown	Unknown		<p><i>Fee review is already done regularly (annually in several cases) and major countywide project began this spring to review fee rates and compare to comparable counties in Oregon.</i></p>
<p><b>UTILITIES REVIEW</b> - Light Power &amp; Water. Do analysis of \$225,000 per month current charges to look for any possible improve efficiencies.</p>	EXP	Unknown	On-going		

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<b>ANALYSIS OF PHONE BILLS</b> - Analyze whether all land lines, cell phones & radio communication equipment is needed. Approx \$88,000 per month charged to "Phones" per transparency reports. \$69,000 to General Fund.	EXP	Unknown	On-going	<i>Amount to General Fund is approx 33% - not 78% noted in proposal. FY 10-11 budget \$962k Countywide &amp; \$323k within General Fund.</i>
<b>EXPENSE REDUCTION TO BE DETERMINED</b> - Management Team will come together and provide a combined recommendation once they have a chance to meet & brainstorm.	EXP	TBD	TBD	
<b>LEGISLATIVE PRIORITY: LOCAL CIGARETTE TAX</b> - Remove prohibition in ORS 323.030 on ORS 323.620 on local tobacco products taxation. Depending on statutory proposal, funds generated through such a proposal could be directed to meet local health mandates as they pertain to tobacco, or more broadly, the duties of the local health authority mandated by ORS 431.416.	REV	\$8.5m	On-going	<i>This proposal may be difficult to achieve in 2011 due to competing interests at the legislature to increase tobacco taxes statewide and the existing distrust of local governments generally to manage such a regulatory collection system. Legislature saw related bills on this in 2009 and 2010 (special session) but they died for lack of hearing.</i>
<b>TOBACCO-FREE LANE COUNTY WORKSITE CAMPUSES</b> - Public Health's Chronic Disease Prevention team recommends that the county adopt a policy banning the use of all tobacco products at every county worksite (inside and out). This policy would ban the use of any lit tobacco product as well as smokeless tobacco products.	EXP	See notes	One-time	<i>Studies show that tobacco use costs an employer more than \$5,600 per smoker per year in greater health care costs, increased absenteeism, work time spent on smoling rituals, higher life insurance premiums, greater risk of occupational injury, costlier disability and more disciplinary action .</i>
<b>INCREASE SUPEVISION FEES FOR OFFENDERS ON SUPERVISION AT PAROLE AND PROBATION</b> - By increasing supervision fees to \$40 per month (up \$5 from the current \$35) could increase monthly revenue by \$18,000 per month.	REV	\$18,000 per month	On-going	<i>Need to check legal issues. Only those that committ crimes are required to pay fees.</i>
