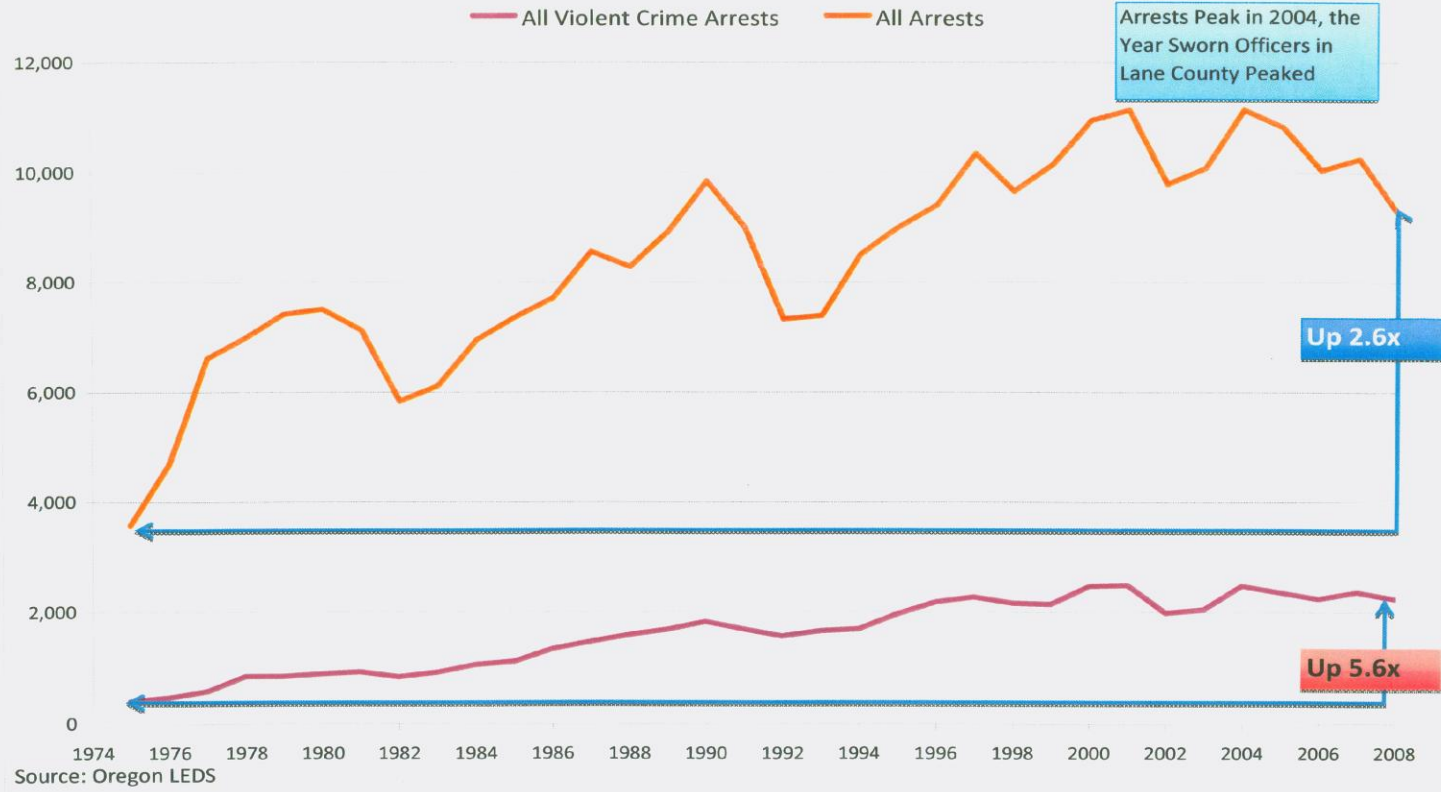

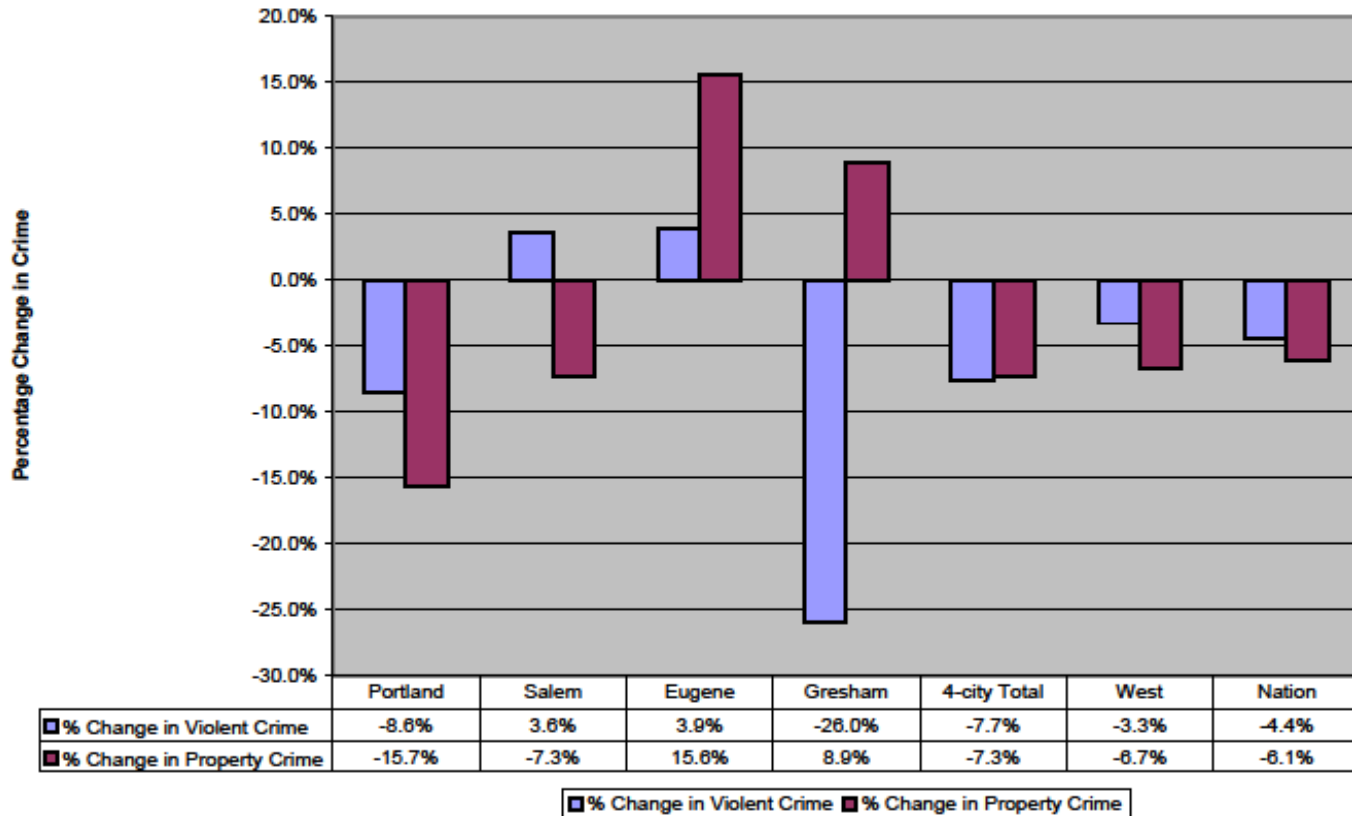
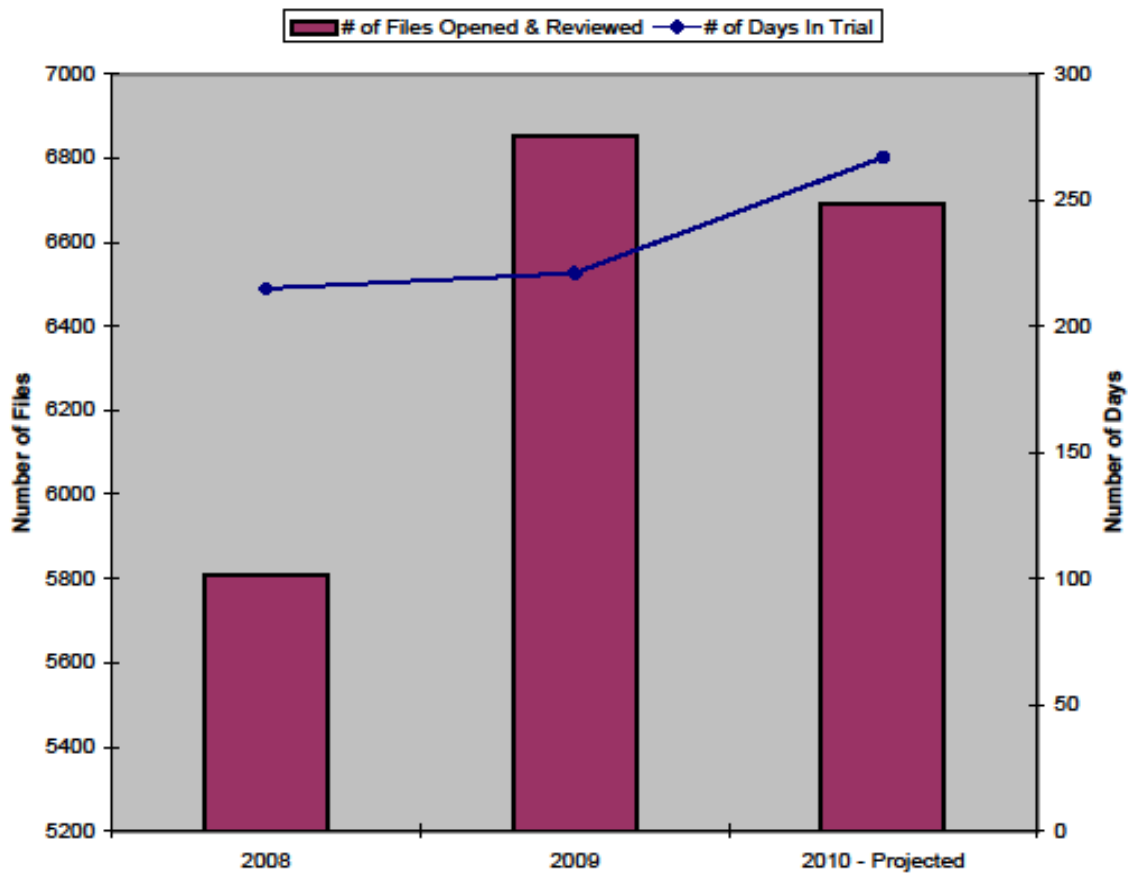
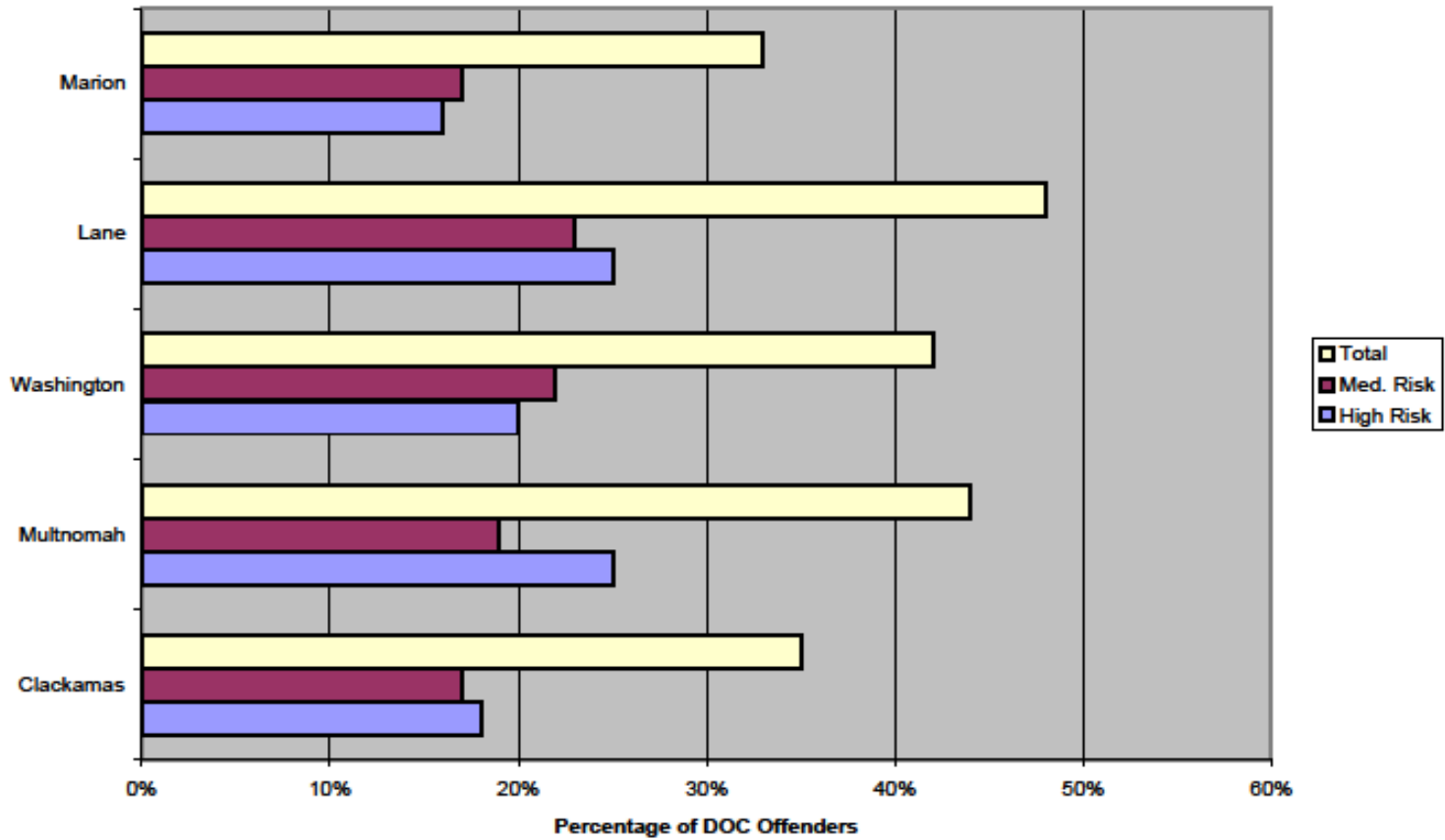

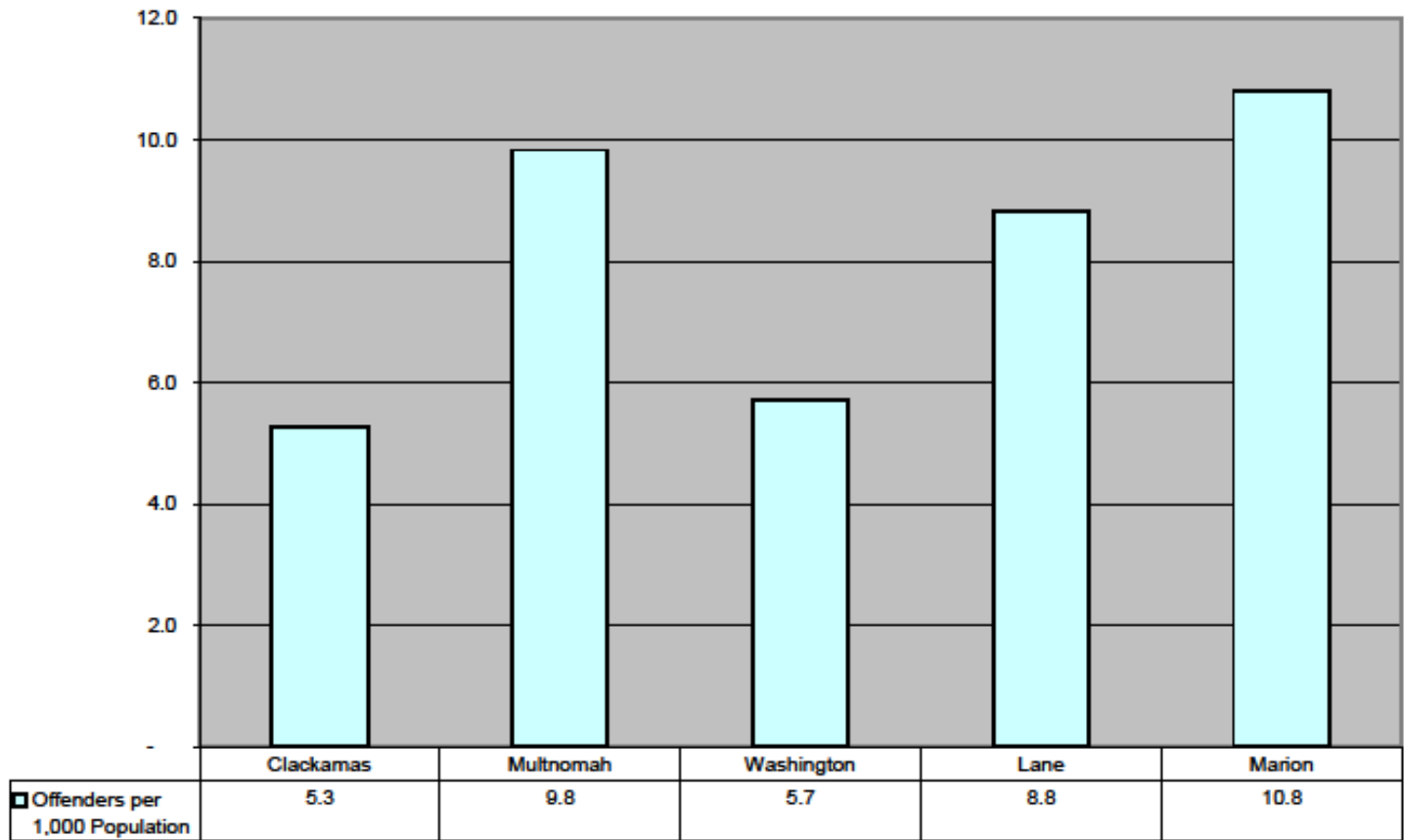
Case and Trial Statistics



Offender Comparisons per DOC



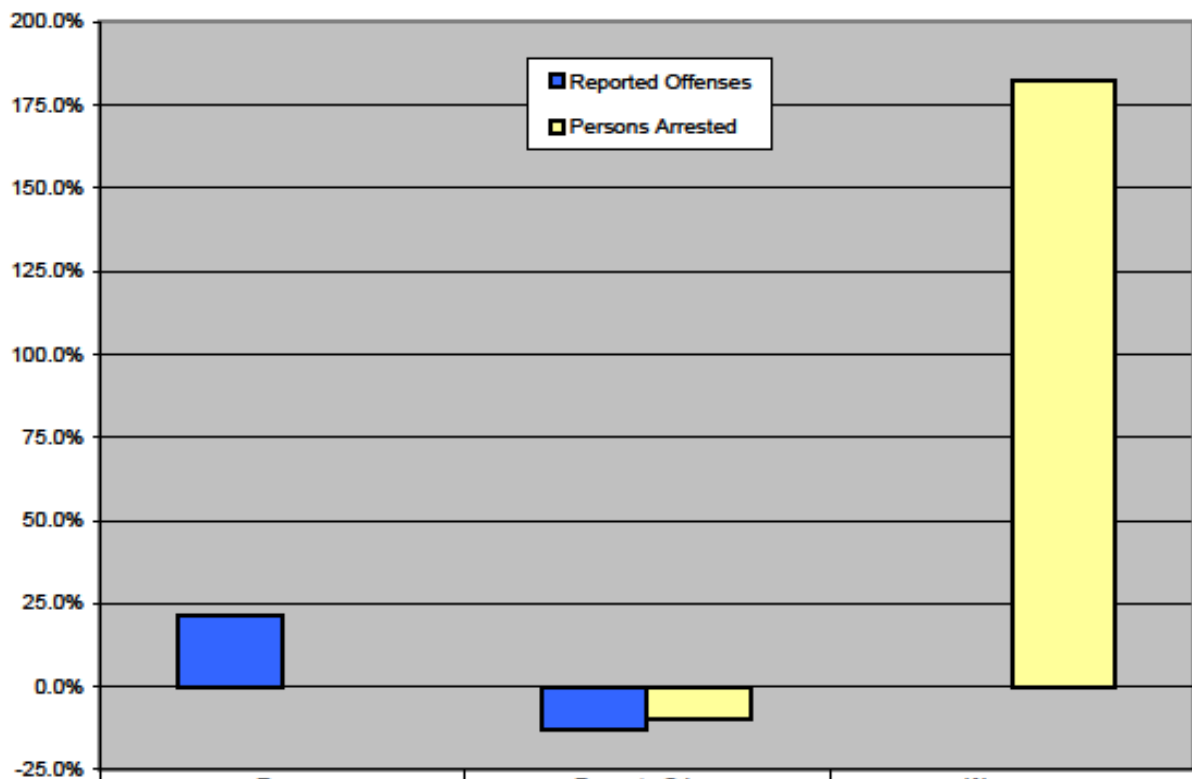
Corrections Offenders per 1,000 Population

Summary

Approaching challenges:

- 1) Kids First funding? (Rural DV grant renew in September?)
- 2) Software replacement \$300K to \$400K (DACMS)
- 3) Morgue construction will be necessary
 - a. Collaboration w/ State?
- 4) Kids FIRST facility?
- 5) System staffing:
 - a. Deputy M.E.s
 - b. Detective-Investigators
 - c. Deputy DAs
 - d. Victim Advocate?

Significant Success stories:

- 1) Drug Court producing stellar results.
- 2) Improved collaboration with agencies/partners (muni-mentals?)
- 3) Transition to running our own Morgue has worked well; \$\$ used to improve staffing
 - a. Only a short term solution – (State regional vision)
- 4) New ME “Remote Processing” model has promise for cost reduction
- 5) Targeting of career criminals is effective & helping to reduce crime
- 6) Victim Services volunteer model is a huge success -- managing over 20% more volume with fewer FTE
- 7) Family law warrant back-log is cleared
- 8) Kids FIRST regional center model is working well.
 - a. Improved training/ with remote capability
- 9) Domestic Violence Team data are very good
 - a. Improved system/partner training across police agencies
