Fast Facts

- Lane County is 4,620 square miles—nearly the size of Connecticut (5,543 square miles)
- Population is 345,880 (2008)
- Ninety percent of Lane County is forestland, yet the Eugene/Springfield area is the second largest urban area in Oregon
- Last year (2008) 15,551 inmates were booked into the jail, one book in for every 22 residents of Lane County
- The Sheriff's Office entered 81,505 calls into Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD)

Lane County Sheriff's Office

Police Services

Patrol

The Sheriff's Office provides 24 hour police patrol for all unincorporated portions of Lane County, covering an area of 4,620 square miles.

Traffic Safety Team

The Traffic Safety Team enforces traffic laws including DUII, seat belt infractions and speeding. The team is also trained in accident reconstruction.

Criminal Investigation Section

One detective is assigned to drug enforcement and two detectives investigate violent personal crimes and sexual offenses against children.

Contract Services

Contract services are funded by various governmental agencies or municipalities and include Marine Patrol; Forest Land; Bureau of Land Management; Dunes; and the cities of Veneta and Creswell.

Transport/Court Security

The Sheriff's Office provides prisoner transportation to and from the jail, courts, and other jurisdictions, as well as court security.

Search and Rescue

The Lane County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue program (SAR) responds to lost, injured, or missing people that are in need of rescue and/or recovery. Many SAR volunteer opportunities exist.

Civil Process

The Sheriff's Office serves subpoenas, protective and eviction orders, and other court orders.



Licenses, Permits, Registration

The Sheriff's Office provides licenses, permits, and registration for a variety of needs including:

- Concealed Handgun Licenses
- Special weapon / firearms registration
- Fingerprinting
- Fireworks
- OLCC
- Sex Offender registration



Corrections

Lane County Adult Corrections Facility

The Lane County Jail, located at 101 West Fifth Avenue in Eugene, was originally constructed in 1979 with additions completed in 1988 and 1999.

For cities and unincorporated areas of Lane County the Sheriff's Office provides supervision, control, and custody of inmates housed in the jail. Currently, there is one jail book-in for every 22 residents of Lane County per year and approximately 70% of the individuals incarcerated in the jail are pre-trial defendants.

Inmates receive mandated services including three balanced meals per day, access to showers and telephones, and medical, dental, and mental health care for those who are in need.

Defendant and Offender Management Center

The purpose of the DOMC is to better assess, place, and manage defendants and offenders for the protection of the community and the integrity of the criminal justice system.

Community Corrections Center

Inmates of the 122 bed Community Corrections Center work at paying jobs or attend school to assist their transition back into society.

Electronic Surveillance

Electronic surveillance is a home confinement incarceration alternative that utilizes Radio Frequency and Global Positioning Satellite (GPS) technology.

Sheriff's Work Crew

Work Crew participants work on projects paid for by local government and non-profit agencies. Workers perform vegetation control, park and trail maintenance, and litter removal.

Parole and Probation

Parole and Probation provides community supervision for approximately 3500 offenders who are on probation or post prison supervision, including misdemeanor and felony domestic violence and sex offenders.

Emergency Management

Emergency Management works with government agencies to mitigate against, prepare for, respond to, and recover from all types of natural and human-caused emergencies and disasters. Visit our web site at www.lanecounty.org/EmerMgmt for more information.
